If you would like to attend, please see Sr Vianney to complete the sign-up sheet in the sacristy.

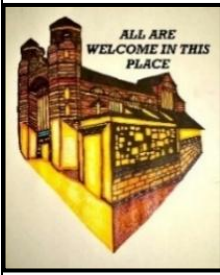


Congratulations to St Joseph's RC Primary School, George Row, on their recent very good Ofsted Inspection Report!!

The new school leadership and staff team have been leading the school through a period of great change. We are very happy that this work has been recognized both in the comments from Ofsted during the inspection and in the written report. 'Pupils are immensely happy at this school and genuinely excited about learning. They are eager to answer questions and challenge themselves. Pupils achieve well in national tests and assessments at the end of Year 6. Disadvantaged pupils also achieve very well over time. In some instances, their attainment in national assessments is above their peers nationally. Pupils are well prepared for their next steps in learning at secondary school. Pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities receive precise support matched to their individual needs. Pupils show great respect for each other. This is evident in their highly positive behaviour. Highly positive relationships between staff and pupils ensure that pupils can share worries when they have them. Leaders and staff foster trusting relationships with parents and carers. The school's values thread through daily life and pupils state that the school is 'like one big happy family'. The school provides extensive enrichment opportunities. A vast range of trips enhance the curriculum. The wide range of clubs enables all pupils to try new activities and develop talents and interests.'

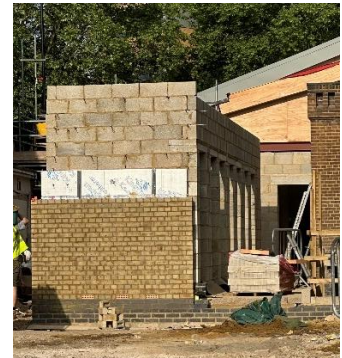
Parish Centre donations last week totalled £ 415.50

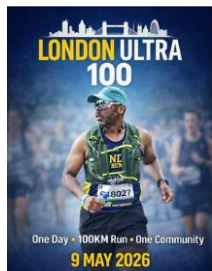

- Gift Aid envelopes in the weekly basket.
- Standing order/online donations/bank transfer: *a/c name: RCAS Bermondsey Dockhead; sort code: 60-21-34; a/c no: 35542756*
- Using a Contactless machine. We have four machines available - one at each door. If you wish the donation to be gift aided, then use the same card if you can. Then once you select all past and future donations, you do not need to re-enter the full details each time.



- You can also donate using Apple Pay, Google Pay, credit and debit cards by scanning the link to the left or going to <https://tinyurl.com/SupportMHT> . The QR code is also the website - just tap it from your phone to donate.
